Step 3: Make A Word Art Frame

Find or print out a picture of one of your ancestors like Miguel had in “Coco.” If you find a picture, glue it to a full sheet of paper. If you print the picture, make sure to print it so that there is space for a frame. Then, make a word art frame around your ancestor by using different colored markers to write words that describe them. For example, here is one Ms. Kristin made of her aunt Debbie who was joyful, smart, kind, and funny.



As an alternative, if a picture is hard to find or it is not possible to print, you can write your ancestor's name in big letters on the center of a paper and then do your word art frame around their name.
